The conductors will need players to conduct, and we encourage additional players for the ensembles. They should enjoy a day's playing and learn what is expected of them by conductors.

Moira Usher is a popular teacher, conductor and pastoral visitor. She is a founder of the Eastern Recorder Orchestra (EROS), which she conducts, and co-founder and conductor of the Suffolk branch of the Society of Recorder Players. She is also tutor at the Recorder Summer School and the Summer Recorder Festival.
