This was a very successfully played and sounded superb in our acoustics. Before we could have our tea break Debbie gave us 5 Ukranian Folk Songs by Lance Eccles. These were a delight to play – we began (as you do!) with the second, then broke for an excellent tea provided by Diana and Felicity, which included Diana's excellent Date slices. After the tea break we continues playing numbers 1,3 and 5. All were fun to play with interesting parts for the whole group with the exception of the bass part of the first piece. After this we went back to using the larger instruments, and also Sheila on the sopranino, playing **Brian Bonsor's** 17th Farewell to Alva, lovely group of Scottish folk songs written for the end of a previous SRP festival. The whole work sounded very good, and we even added a solo tenor part played by Mary. We concluded the afternoon with and arrangement by Alex Ayre of Boyce's Allegro from Symphony number 5 -for so late in the afternoon there were a lot of semiquavers in all parts. But we coped very well and it was a lovely way to finish the afternoon. Thank you again Debbie, for steering us through such a lovely selection of music. -
